
Brief history




- April 6, 1968, astronomers from Belgium, Denmark, France, Germany, Netherlands met with a goal: to create a European Journal substituting the many national and local astronomical journals and bulletins (a response to ApJ/AJ).
- First issue of A&A: Jan 1969.
- Today it is a consortium of sponsoring organisations from 25* countries in Europe and beyond. (www.aanda.org/board-of-directors)
- 2016 Impact Factor: 5.016: 2nd of the "big 4"

Brief history






Organisation I




- Board of Directors: one member from each sponsoring organisation.
 - It is the governing body, owns the journal.
 - Long-term (scientific) policies of the journal
 - Appoints the Scientific Editors
 - Negotiates contract with the Publisher
- Scientific Editors: responsible for the contents of the journal; manage the refereeing process; Editorial Office day-to-day interface with Publisher
- Publisher: production, sales, distribution, promotion (SWYA)*
- Agreement with ESO
- Collaboration with CDS

Organisation II




- Board of Directors
- Scientific Editors
- Publisher
- Agreement with ESO: acts on behalf of the Board for contractual, legal matters and financial administration.
 Receives a payment, one representative in the Board and is the depositary of copyright.
- Collaboration with CDS: Paid on-line publication* of article data

Economic Model



- The Sponsoring Bodies share the operation cost of the Journal (Editorial Offices, Board, etc) which is mainly set by annual contributions. Extra: page charges, OA
- Publishing is done by an external contractor the Publisher.
 - A&A does not pay the Publisher's services.
 - The **Publisher** makes a **profit by selling subscriptions**.
 - The Publisher hands to A&A a revenue fixed by the Board.
- Authors from sponsoring countries do not pay page charges.
- The Journal cannot accumulate reserves.*

A&A Open Access



"Publicly funded research should be available to public". Yes, but costs money and someone has to pay it

Green Open Access (e.g. ArXiv)
Gold OA (free access) after one year

Immediate Gold OA:

- Letters
- [Sec 12] Atomic, molecular, and nuclear data
- [Sec 13] Astronomical instrumentation
- [Sec 14] Catalogs and data
- [Sec 15] Numerical methods and codes

Latest issue is freely accessible

Hybrid GOA: Immediate - authors pay fee


A&A is thus very OA! Future will depend on policy makers

Full Gold OA → significantly higher page charges/contributions

Publishing in A&A



A&A has the motto "a Journal run by astronomers for astronomers"


Who can publish

What can be published:

- "Papers should present new astronomical results or ideas of sufficient interest to the community" (regular and letters)
- Must follow a code of ethical conduct: plagiarism, self plagiarism, improper attribution, multiple journals

Assessed by the **editors** with the invaluable help of the **referees**

Scientific editing



- Scientific Editors (11): responsible for the contents of the journal; manage the refereeing process; take the decision of publishing a paper or not
- Editorial Office day-to-day interface with Publisher



Scientific Editors **are not** a PBX limited to sending papers to referees.

Editing - Initial filtering




Not for A&A (~5% - decision by 2 editors):

- Crackpots (filtered by Editor in Chief)
- Evidently flawed
- Not enough material (changes with time)
- Too specialised (subcomponent of an instrument, calibration reports, etc...)
- Outside astronomy (image processing, etc...)

Written/structured well enough? English good enough? (don't waste referee's time)

Editing - Initial filtering




Manuscripts should be submitted to appropriate section (and written with that in mind). Specially if they might be perceived as not having enough astronomical results.

Can affect specially:

- Instruments and observational techniques
- Catalogs and data papers
- Papers on special subjects

Editing - peer review I



Most difficult part of the job: Finding good referees

This is a presentation subject on its own right

Referees work for free (or for an A&A calendar!)


Potential referees judge papers from abstract (a reason for a very good abstract); reputation of the authors

A lot harder to find a referee for a poor paper: much more work; easiest report is "publish as is"; hardest is rejection and much less fun


Add referee quality-control (blacklist, conflict, too slow..)




Cumulative distribution of acceptance times for Letters in 2016






Misconception: Referees are from sponsoring countries




Some feedback II

- Subject X is discriminated against subject Y


Other comments

- Speed of peer-reviewing process





The following percentages are based on the 189 positive replies to Question 4.1.1.




3.1.6. In general, how satisfied are you with the performance of A&A Editors?







3.1.5. Please rate the general usefulness of the peer-review process in improving the articles that you submitted to A&A



5.1.1. How would you qualify the importance of English-language editing for the overall perceived quality of A&A articles?


